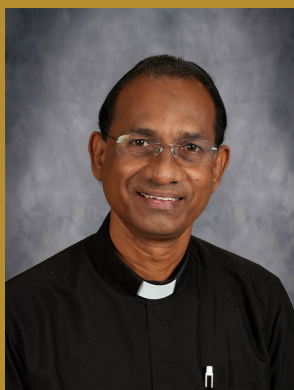
My experience with you in the past year is how people within our parish give to the life and mission of our parish community, a community that exists for mission and ministry, not only here, but out in the world!

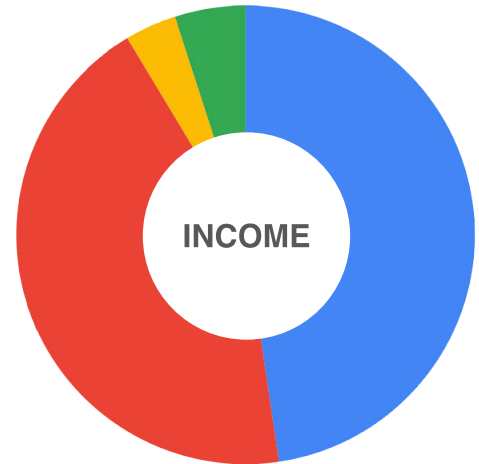

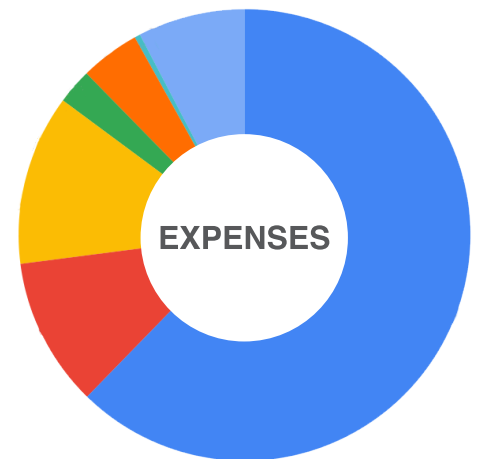

# CELEBRATING PROGRESS

## Completed Projects in the Past Year

We are grateful to reflect on a year marked by meaningful improvements to our parish and school facilities—projects that strengthen our mission, enhance safety, and enrich the beauty of our worship and learning spaces. Through careful stewardship and the generosity of our community, the following initiatives were completed during the past year:

- **School Roof Renovation – Phase I:** A significant section of the school roof was replaced, addressing long-term maintenance needs and helping to protect our classrooms and ministry spaces for years to come.
- **Ballistic-Rated Window Film:** For the safety and security of our students, staff, and parishioners, ballistic-rated protective film was installed on windows throughout the entire campus.
- **New School Entry Doors:** The main entrance to the school was upgraded with secure, durable doors that improve both accessibility and safety.
- **Advent Banners:** Beautiful new banners now adorn our worship space during the Advent season, helping to draw hearts and minds into this sacred time of preparation.
- **Nativity Scene and Stable:** A new outdoor nativity and stable were generously donated, providing a reverent and welcoming reminder of Christ's birth to all who visit our campus.
- **Carpet Replacement in Faith Formation Offices and Adoration Chapel:** New carpeting was installed in these important spaces through the kindness of a parishioner whose legacy continues to bless our community even after their passing.



Each of these projects represents more than bricks, fabric, or fixtures — they reflect our shared commitment to creating a safe, welcoming, and prayerful home for all who gather here. We offer sincere thanks to the many parishioners, donors, and volunteers whose generosity made this progress possible.

# LOOKING AHEAD

## Priorities for the Coming Year

As we plan for the year ahead, we continue to focus on initiatives that enhance security, accessibility, and the comfort of those who worship and learn on our campus. The following projects are being evaluated and prayerfully considered:



**New Gymnasium Doors:** Installation of updated doors to provide more meaningful security for students and visitors using the gym and adjacent spaces.



**Expanded Keyless Door Access:** Additional keyless entry points to simplify access to meeting rooms and ministry spaces after normal business hours while maintaining appropriate security.



**Upgrades in the School Administration Hallway:** Further improvements to the door access system in this area to better protect students and streamline daily operations.



**Replacement of Adoration Chapel Chairs:** New seating that offers greater comfort and reverence for those spending time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.



**Seating for the Infirm at the Back of Church:** Replacement of chairs to better accommodate parishioners with limited mobility, ensuring that all feel welcome and able to participate fully in the liturgy.



These potential projects flow from our ongoing commitment to be good stewards of the resources entrusted to us and to care well for every person who enters our doors. With God's guidance and the continued generosity of our parish family, we look forward to another year of faithful growth and improvement, building a place where faith can flourish for generations to come.
